1. Introduction

DG Unlimited (DGU) recognises the climate emergency and is committed to playing an active role in reducing our carbon footprint, preserving our natural environment, and supporting a just transition to a greener future.

As an organisation rooted in Dumfries and Galloway a region of outstanding natural beauty, a UNESCO Biosphere, home to the Galloway Forest Park, RSPB reserves on the Solway Coast, and the Southern Upland Way we take seriously our responsibility to protect the land, sea, wildlife and communities we serve.

3. Our Environmental Aims


We will:

- Promoting responsible and low-impact cultural tourism











5. Practical Actions We Will Take

- Use digital meetings and events wherever appropriate to reduce travel
- Choose venues with environmental credentials and accessible public transport
- Promote lift-sharing and low-emission travel among participants and staff
- Minimise printing and paper use; use recycled or FSC-certified materials
- Avoid single-use plastics at events
- Reuse materials and equipment where possible
- Use local suppliers to reduce transport emissions and support the local green economy
- Include environmental clauses in partner and contractor agreements
- Consider environmental impact when making funding decisions or evaluating projects

6. Monitoring and Reporting

We will track and report on our performance annually. We will share learning with Creative Scotland and our networks and continue to improve.

7. Staff and Stakeholder Engagement

We will provide training and guidance to our Board, staff, and delivery partners to promote climate literacy and support a culture of care and environmental responsibility.

8. Review and Continuous Improvement

This policy will be reviewed every year to ensure it reflects new evidence, policy developments, and community priorities.
